I am glad that you have departed and hope you have a wonderful stay on the Riviera! I hope it is not too hot this time of year. At the seaside, everyone enjoys the refreshing breeze. I am also considering going on vacation this week, probably on Wednesday. This year, I have decided to stay at the Baltic Sea instead of my beloved Switzerland to save money. It is also difficult to change currency. Some of my friends drove up there today to see if my diet could be accommodated. My prospective address is: Prerow Seaside Resort in Pomerania, Wiesengrund House. I still have three weeks of vacation. I am also unsure if I can still visit Karlsruhe afterwards. On the one hand, I would have to shorten my stay at the Baltic Sea. On the other hand, I would encounter travel and financial difficulties along the way. Should I postpone my visit until Christmas this year as well? We can discuss it some more in the near

future.

On Friday, Dr. A.R.F personally called me and requested that I visit his apartment in the morning. He was friendly when I asked for his advice. He described the opportunity in the USA as very challenging for me. However, I couldn't help but get the impression that he didn't want me to accept it. He also emphasized again and again that apart from understanding my viewpoint, he couldn't see any reason for a change. Upon my request, however, he promised to keep an eye on the matter and think about it while traveling to Italy!
