English Translation

Stockholm, 26 November 1896

My dearest friend Bredig,

The local students want to hold our traditional founding day celebration in January, as usual. Rindell told them a lot about your play "Venus of Amylo" and now they want to translate, localize, and perform it. They request that you to send this fin-de-siècle play to me, and would be immensely grateful. Yesterday, I had my last university lecture of the year and now I only have one public lecture to hold tomorrow evening. Afterwards, I am free until the beginning of February.

There is not much news about the university. Rindell, whom you know, works at the institute and lives with me, which pleases me greatly. Give my regards to our friends, especially Ostwald, his wife, and children. Greetings from your dear friend, Svante Arrhenius
