### English Translation

5 June 1936, Karlsruhe

Dear Max-Albert,

Many thanks for your letter from the 1st of this month, which I received in Baden-Baden. I returned home from there yesterday. The weather was still very nice, and the springtime atmosphere was splendid. I also enjoyed spending a few days with my two older, albeit not aging, sisters. Of course, after the weather here turned very cold and miserable, I am back to sitting in my heated home, where the silence is becoming more pervasive. I am enclosing a page with letters from two of my former doctoral students in Heidelberg, Fajans and Denham, who coincidentally met in Cambridge. Please return them.

It is probably true that you can only do so much before you are let go. You must be responsible and careful until then. At any rate, learn English, stay healthy, and remain vigilant.

I don't have much to report except that I have a cold, but not a fever. Be kind to Marianne and attentive to Aunt Kaethe. The same goes for Aunt Vally when she visits. Aunt Fraenze

returned yesterday from Berlin. Write often.
